

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MINTO

BY-LAW NO. 00-46

Being a by-law to provide for the removal and disposal of animal waste within the Town of Minto.

WHEREAS Section 102 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980 c.M.45 as amended, provides that a municipal council may pass by-laws for the health, safety, morality and welfare of the inhabitants of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to provide for the removal and disposition of animal excrement;


NOW THEREFORE the council of the Corporation of the Town of Minto enacts as follows:

1. Except as provided in paragraph 2, every person who owns, possesses or is in control of any animal shall be responsible for the immediate removal and sanitary disposition of any excrement of such animal deposited within the boundaries of the Corporation of the Town of Minto.
2. This by-law shall not apply to:
 - (a) excrement from a guide dog while in control of a blind person.
 - (b) Excrement on the property of the person, who owns, possesses or is in control of the animal.
3. Any person contravening the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offense and on conviction is liable to a fine of not more than \$200.00 exclusive of cost.
4. All previous animal waste by-laws of the former Village of Clifford, the former Town of Harriston, the former Town of Palmerston and the former Township of Minto become null and void on the passing of this by-law.

Part 1 Provincial Offences Act

By-law 00-46, a by-law to provide for the removal and disposal of animal waste within the Town of Minto.

Item	Column 1, Short form wording	Column 2, Offence creating provision	Column 3, Set fine (includes costs)
1	Fail to remove and dispose of animal excrement in a sanitary manner.	Section 1	\$200.00
